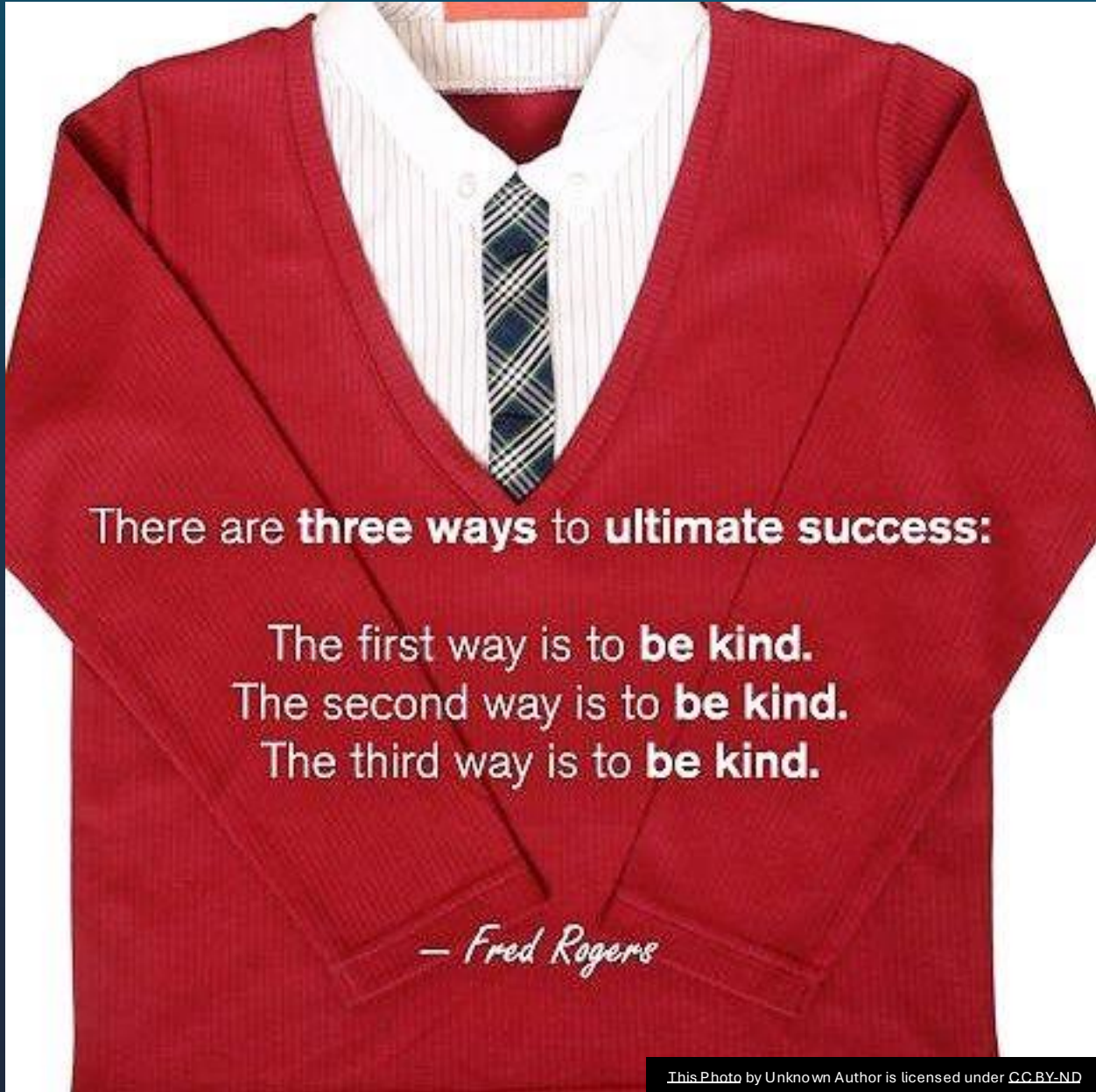

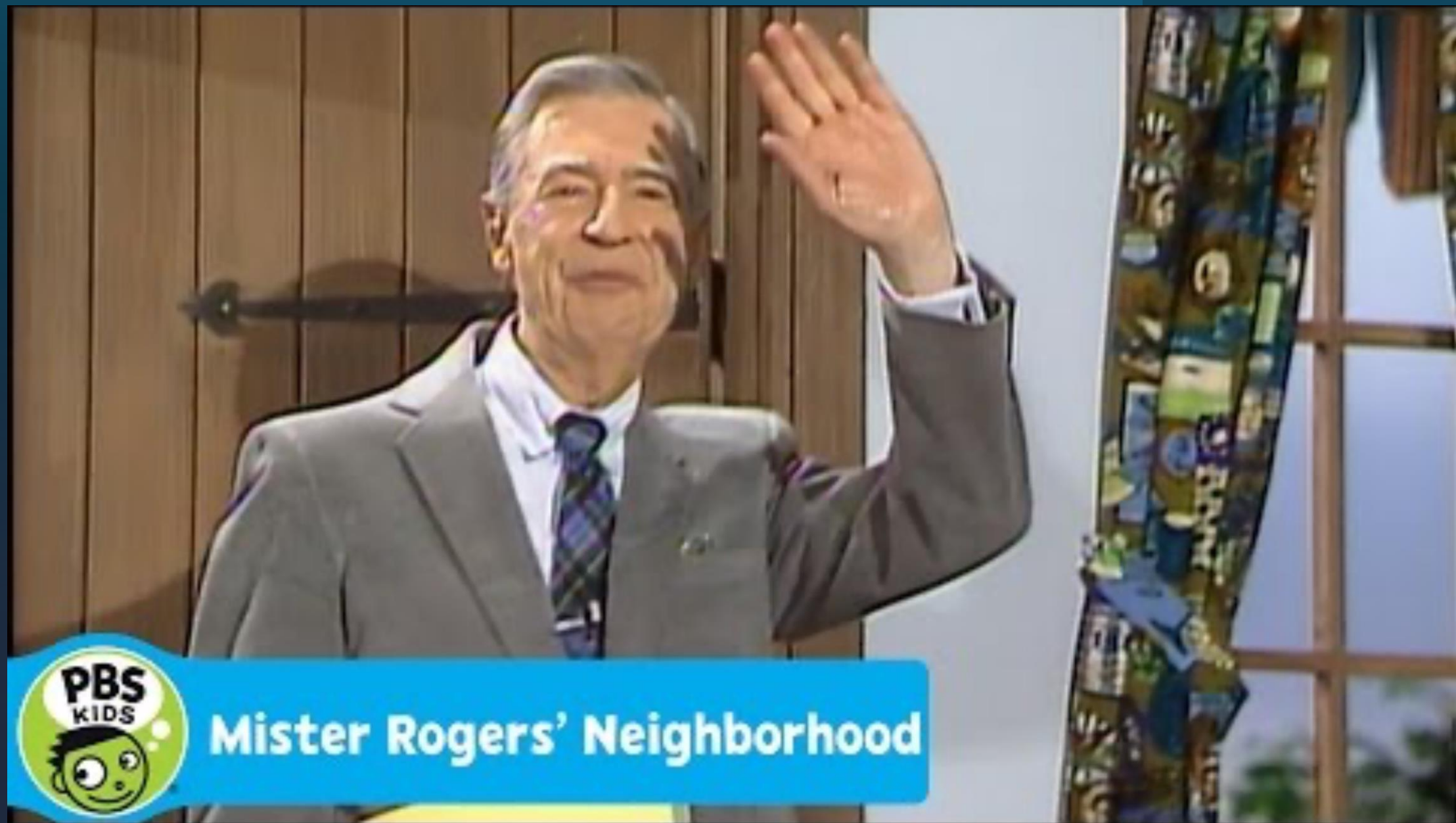

**Mister Rogers' Neighborhood**

**In 1969, when Black Americans were still prevented from swimming alongside whites, Mr. Rogers invited Officer Clemmons to join him in cooling their feet in a pool—breaking a well-known color barrier. Afterward, they dried their feet with the same towel, a quiet but powerful act of unity.**

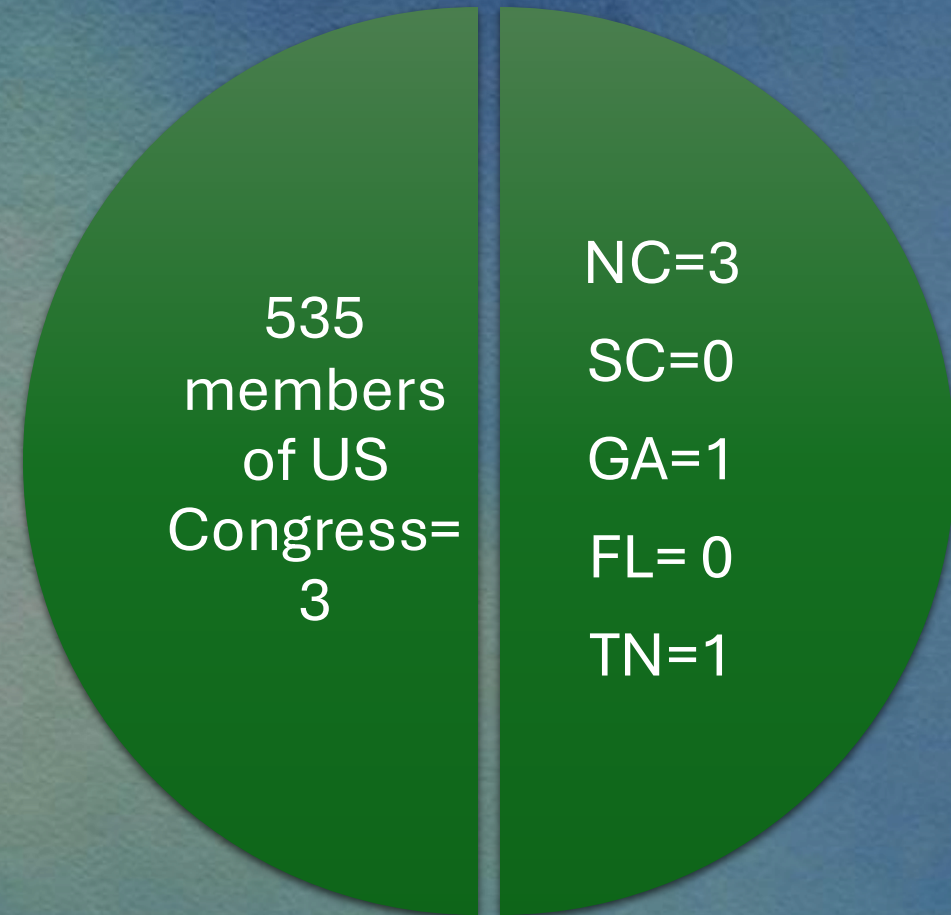
