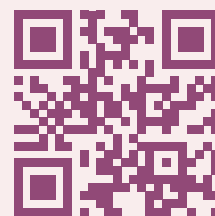

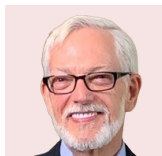

Visionary perioperative leaders are no longer defined by what they manage, but by what they design. Quantum Caring Leadership (QCL) offers a discipline-specific nursing leadership framework integrating Caring Science, quantum leadership, and complexity science to guide how leaders shape culture, teams, and system

design. In perioperative environments where precision, trust, resilience, and human dignity must coexist, traditional leadership models grounded primarily in hierarchy, efficiency, and control are increasingly insufficient for modern surgical ecosystems.

Balancing Technology with Human Judgment: AI & Safety

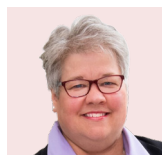

As artificial intelligence becomes embedded in perioperative practice, nurses face a challenge that is both practical and ethical: knowing when to trust the technology and when to trust themselves. This session explores the intersection of AI, patient safety, and human judgment — examining how clinicians can maintain moral agency and ethical accountability in environments where algorithmic tools increasingly influence clinical decisions. Through discussion and interactive exercises, participants will examine real-world tensions between data-driven systems and the irreplaceable role of human judgment in keeping patients safe.

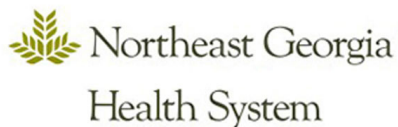
